



The 2nd Klondike Longbow Tournament Malvern Archers Saturday 26th August 2017

Tournament Report and Results



We had a fantastic sunny day for our second Klondike Longbow tournament and some great company. Jeff fired up the BBQ and Ali kept the Tea, Coffee and cold drinks flowing.

For the Gents, Henry took a few ends to get into gear, he joked that it was something about 'the field sloping the other way to what he was used to', but he had established a good lead by the end of the first distance and despite John matching his 50 yard score and claiming the "Best Gold" prize at that distance the lead was only to grow by the end of the round.

Rob kept the pressure on John throughout and these two had a very close match with only 2 hits and 6 points separating them as the final arrow was shot. It was not surprising that these three Gents shared the medals, but there were some close battles throughout the field, Nick, Nigel and Richard were only separated by 4 hits and Allan and Tim were only a gnat's whisker apart. Nick had the next highest score after our medallists and landed the "worst white" on the first end at 40yds. In fairness there were much worse scoring arrows on the bosses throughout the day, mostly mine, but unfortunately Nick's was the one to count.





Our top three Ladies out scored all but the top three Gents and had a very close match themselves with only 7 hits and 7 points separating them. Fang had the best 60 yards with most hits and highest score. Alison found her mark at 50 yards and Penny saved her best for a sprint finish at 40 yards that saw her end with the highest score and Alison also edged passed Fangs score, but neither could claw back the earlier deficit of hits, leaving Fang as top Lady for the day.



I dusted off my Longbow and discovered a new level of respect for the traditionalists, while shooting everywhere but where I was attempting to hit, I was given many useful tips on technique and a whole new list of excuses.
