



Achieving Club Records

1. Club records do not have to be claimed. Any score that is submitted into Golden Records that beats the previous score for a round, will automatically be considered for approval to be promoted to a club record.
2. There is no differentiation between club records shot in practice or in competition. Malvern Archers have taken this approach for many years and now has a rich history of records. This also allows all club members to achieve club records.
3. Rounds shot in competition, that beat an existing record, will be considered for approval, but verification against the competition results sheet may be required.
4. Rounds shot in practice, that beat an existing record, will be considered for approval. This is done with the **trust** that all rules are followed and that all scoring/line cutter calls are done accurately. If there is any suspicion of cheating, foul play or incorrect scores, the Record Officer and/or Committee may reject your score and club record.
5. Scores submitted into Golden Records, that are to be considered for club records, must have all details completed accurately, or they will be rejected.
6. When entering a new score into Golden Records, you may get a message advising you that the score could be a club record. Golden Records is not without its quirks, and it may not be a record after all. All records must be verified against the existing record and then approved by the Records Officer.
7. Updates to Golden Records now allow records to be broken if a new score submitted matches the old score but has more X's or Golds. Whilst this is the correct rule, some historic records were not recorded with X's or Golds, in which case, the new record may also have to beat the old record on score. It is at the discretion of the Records Officer to decide if a new score record is valid.
8. Club Records can only be achieved by full members of Malvern Archers. Associate members cannot achieve club records.
9. Club Records will normally be approved within 4 weeks of score submission.

Please be honest and do not cheat, otherwise your scores may get rejected!
The club does not want to have to implement a more stringent system for scoring practice rounds requiring witnesses and independent target companions.
