



Claiming 252 Badges

1. To claim a 252 badge, you must shoot two rounds at the distance that you wish to claim a badge for, and both scores must achieve the required score level.
2. To find the required score levels for your bow style, please review the information on the club website for the 252 Round:

3. A single round consists of six ends of six arrows shot at the required distance.
4. Only one end of sighters can be shot (6 arrows). You can choose not to have a sighter end, but this must be decided BEFORE shooting ANY arrows.
5. Club rules allow you to shoot more than one 252 round in the same day but they must be at different distances, and sighters are only allowed on the first round.
6. Each time that you shoot a 252 round, the score must be entered into Golden Records so that the score is recorded and so that the Records Officer can view the score.
7. If you don't have access to Golden Records, please contact the club Records Officer. You will need to provide the email that you like to use for your account., along with information such as age category and bow style. The Records Officer can then add you as a new user and you will receive a confirmation email. You may also need to review the club document, *Entering Scores into Golden Records*, found on the club website.
8. Once you have shot two valid 252 scores at the same distance and entered them into Golden Records, please make a claim through the club website to claim your badge:

9. 252 rounds can only be achieved by full members of Malvern Archers. Associate members must make 252 claims through their primary club.
10. 252 claims will normally be approved within 4 weeks of claim submission. You will be notified if there is an issue with any of your scores.
11. Badges are £4 each for seniors with the first badge being free. All badges are free of charge for juniors.

When shooting a 252 round, the club trusts that all rules are followed and scoring/line cutter calls are done accurately. If there is any suspicion of cheating, foul play or incorrect scores, the Record Officer and/or Committee may reject your score and badge claim.
